The hull is supported by a mahogany framework reinforced with multiple longitudinal stringers, a structural arrangement that distributes loads efficiently throughout the vessel and enhances overall strength and durability. Lightweight aluminum alloys were incorporated into key components such as the mast girders, engine beds, and other structural elements, reducing overall displacement without sacrificing strength or integrity. Complementing these construction features is a slender hull form, measuring approximately 29.6 meters in length with a beam of 5.3 meters, reflecting the design philosophy of Laurent Giles, whose yachts were renowned for their seaworthiness, efficient sailing performance, and smooth motion through waves. LAMADINE is for anyone who dreams of starring in classic yacht regattas.

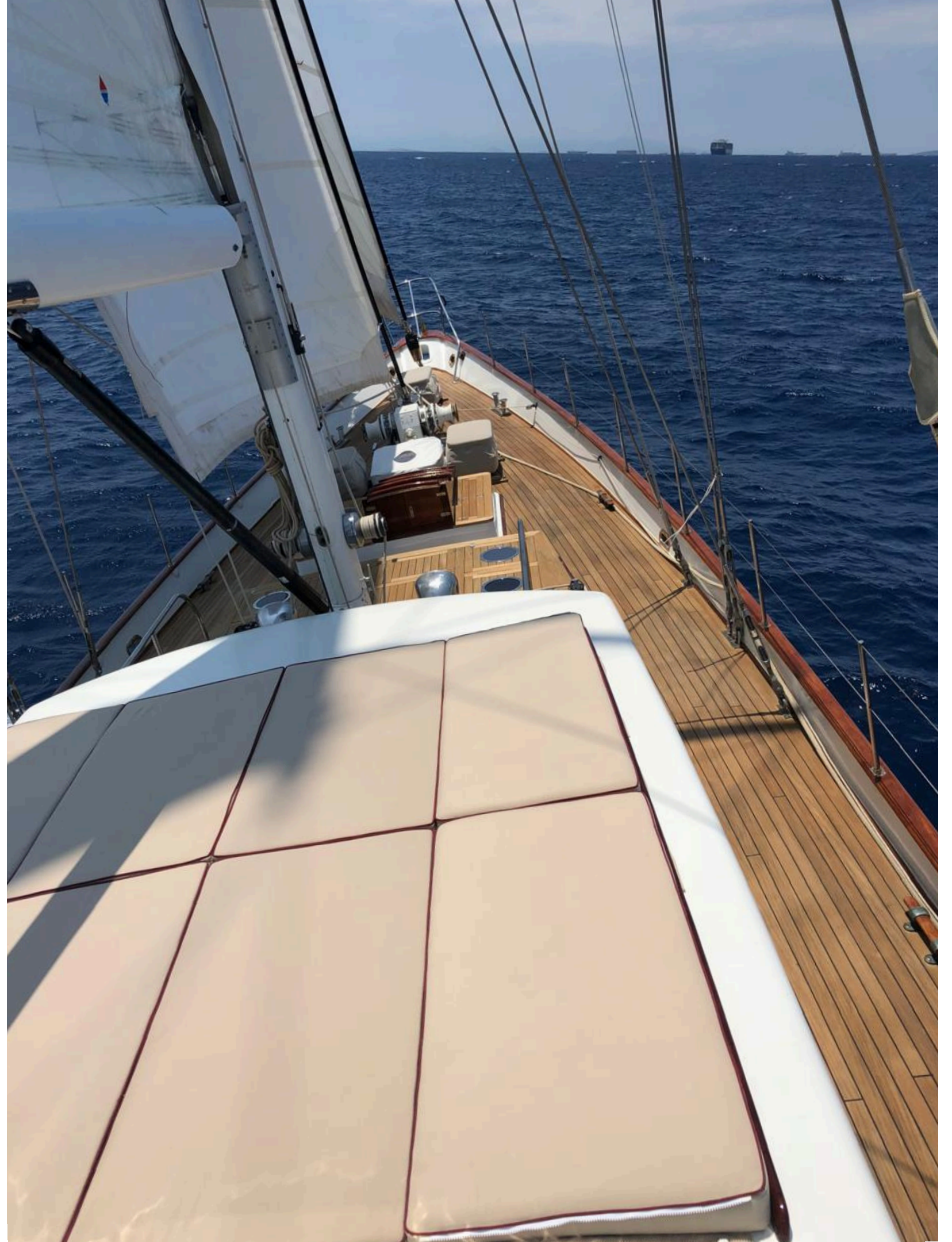
Powered by twin Caterpillar diesel engines, she cruises comfortably at 12 knots and reaches a maximum speed of 14 knots, offering a cruising range of approximately 2,000 nautical miles.
